Patient's Rights

Receive services that respect dignity and protect the health and safety of each person.

Receive information on the benefits and risks of methadone treatment.

Patient will receive an individualized treatment plan, developed and reviewed with both the patient and clinic staff involvement, suited to the patient's needs.

Patients have the right to accept or refuse treatment services.

Prompt and confidential treatment.

The right to exercise all civil, political, personal and property rights to which you are entitled as a citizen.

Treatment provided free of abuse to include physical, verbal, psychological, and sexual abuse, as well as, free from retaliation, harassment, physical punishment, and neglect.

Treatment free from humiliating, threatening, and exploiting actions to include financial exploitation.

The right to review your chart with staff supervision.

The right to receive a written notice of the address and telephone number of the state licensing authority.

The right to receive referral to legal entities for appropriate representation.

Access to self-help and advocacy support services.

The right to obtain a copy of the program's most recent completed report of licensing inspection from the program upon written request.

The right to express preferences regarding choice of counselor.

The ability to consent or refuse or express choice regarding involvement in research projects, and to have facility and staff adhere to research guidelines and ethics when you are involved in a research project.

The right to informed consent or refusal or expression of choice regarding; service delivery, release of information, and concurrent services.

The right to file a complaint, without fear of discrimination or retaliation, if you think any of these rights have been restricted or denied and to have them investigated by the program within a reasonable period of time.

Anyone interested in seeking treatment, obtaining further information, or referring someone for treatment should contact the facility during business hours.

This facility only accepts individuals appropriate for out-patient narcotic addiction treatment in accordance with federal and state regulations.

All services provided at this facility are confidential and are provided under the regulations established by the federal government.

Benefits of medication assisted treatment include: reduced or stopped use of injection drugs, reduced risk of overdose and of acquiring or transmitting diseases, reduced mortality, reduced criminal activity, and improved family stability and employment potential.

Substance abuse treatment has been shown to have a benefit-cost ratio of 7:1; the largest savings were due to reduced cost of crime and increased employer earnings.

In Washington State a comparison of medical expenses of Medicaid clients who received treatment noted that methadone patients were responsible for \$230 worth of savings per Medicaid member, per month.

In California, treated patients have been shown to reduce: ER visits by 39%, hospital stays by 35%, and total medical costs by 26% when compared to a control group.

GPA Treatment of Macon, Inc. began providing treatment to persons struggling with opioid addiction in 2002. Since that time, the facility has achieved four consecutive three-year accreditations with CARF International. The past two CARF International surveys resulted in no recommendations, which is an extraordinary accomplishment that only three percent of CARF surveys experience.
